End of Year School Newsletter

Dear Parent/Guardian,

We are on the final countdown. I cannot believe that we are finishing on Thursday. Where did the time go? It's been a busy time here during the month of June.

6th class trip to Tannagh Adventure Centre: On Thursday the 3rd of June 6th class pupils had a very enjoyable day at Tannagh Adventure Centre. Photos were sent to parents on clasdojo. Thanks to Mrs Clarke for organising the trip for the pupils. It was important that they ended their time in Crosserlough by having a special day out together.

Standardised Tests: All classes from 1st to 6th have now completed their annual standardised tests. Active Schools Week: All pupils participated in outdoor activities with their class from the 8th to the 11th of June. On the 9th of June each class performed a dance prepared by Mary Farrelly. 5th & 6th performed a dance routine from the musical "Grease".

Sport's Day – All classes enjoyed their Sport's Day with their class. It was a huge success and the weather held up. Thanks to all the teachers and SNA who organised fun activities for their classes to enjoy.

School Books and Stationary list for 2021/2022 – Books and stationary to be purchased for next year was sent with school reports to parents on Monday 14th June.
